Transfer Credit Articulation Agreement

St. Charles Community College

Students who complete the General Transfer Studies Associate in Arts degree at St. Charles Community College will receive transfer credit for all General Education requirements in that degree program toward a Bachelor of Science degree program in University College. Transfer credit also is awarded for Physical Education and elective courses.

Transfer credit from St. Charles Community College from General Education and elective course work will satisfy most of the General Education requirements at University College. All students transferring into University College must complete two English Composition courses (EComp 203 and 300-level EComp course) and at least half of their chosen major coursework in residence at University College.

- Additional course work at University College includes, at minimum:
 - Critical and Researched Writing (U11 203)
 - one advanced writing course
 - course requirements for the major.
- Transfer credit is awarded for courses with grades of C- or higher.
- Transfer credit is awarded for ENGL 101 with a grade of B or higher.
- A maximum of 66 units of credit from St. Charles Community College may be transferred to University College.

See the chart below for more specific information, including approved elective courses from St. Charles Community College. Students should meet with an academic advisor from University College to review and approve all transfer credit.


